A message from the desk of Pastor Martin Cornes ... June 2023

As you may have heard, sadly I am coming to the end of my time at Gloria Dei. I have received a call to The Alley church in Cottage Grove. ('The Alley,' named after Jesus' parable of the banquet, where the guests give excuses for attending, and so Jesus tells His servants to go out to the highway and byways, the alleyways and backstreets and gather people in; our mission as Christians.)

Back in 2018 the District encouraged me to start the Specific Ministry Pastor course. A four-year course to become a pastor. (Previously I was a Youth Pastor in England and became a DCE in Minnesota when we moved here.) My specific ministry as a pastor is to be involved in revitalizing churches, as well as to help with outreach and multi-ethnic ministry.

In January 2020, 3 ½ years ago, we arrived at Gloria Dei as it was looking for alternative options to closing. Over this time all of us together have revitalized Gloria Dei. There is a sense of joy here. The Fellowship is so warm and welcoming. People have come through our doors and found a place which they want to call home. I pray that you don't lose that! And as you have grown in your faith and knowledge and love of the Lord and His Word, so you have put that into practice, serving as missionaries in so many different ways as you are sent. We have also begun a partnership with Matthew Cephus and Royal Family church, which is providing great opportunities for us both.

I have loved being here. My family has loved being here. You folks are so warm and welcoming, so giving and so willing to welcome me and my family in.

During my time here, I have received half my salary from Gloria Dei, and the other half was made up from the District and St Matthew, Columbia Heights. Those amounts were always to last a set time, so last summer the contribution from St Matthew's came to an end. And at Christmas the District contribution ended. As part of this situation the District has looked into alternatives to make up the other half of my salary. We looked at a partnership with another church, where I would serve here alternative weeks. They looked at the possibility of me serving at another place during the week and Gloria Dei at the weekend. And also, when churches who were looking for a pastor requested information, my details were sent over. This culminated in me receiving a call from The Alley church in Cottage Grove, which I have now accepted.

My last Sunday at Gloria Dei will be on June 25, there will also be a luncheon, (my last Bible Study will be on Wednesday, June 28). It will be wonderful to see as many people as possible as we come together to celebrate God's goodness to us all. I will start at The Alley on July 1, and my installation date, to which you are invited, will be the afternoon of August 13.

For Gloria Dei, I know this will probably come as quite a shock. But, I would encourage any of you who might have an interest – whether a member or not, a long time congregant or more recent attender, to attend the meeting after church on June 4.

I also hope that over these next few weeks, as my time comes to an end, you will be praying for me and my family as we follow the Lord's guidance – it's never easy to finish at a place you love and then move to start something new. Pray also for yourselves at Gloria Dei, as we too will be praying for you. Let's hold on to the faith, the trust, the assurance that we have in the Lord, that He will lead us through this, yes somewhat turbulent and uncertain time, but at the same time stepping into an exciting future, trusting in God's faithfulness, looking to the past and how He has blessed us and provided the right answers to prayer. In the meantime, if there is anything I can do, please don't hesitate to reach out.

What Do You Want?

One of the best-known and most-beloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we actually suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pastures and still waters).

We live as though we are not the Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the business of helping those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word.

Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the Good News: the Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The Lord is your Shepherd. Let us live as His sheep.



DOMINICAN REPUBLIC — JUNE 1-30

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) officially began work in the Dominican Republic in 2004. Over the years, a group home was established to care for orphaned children with disabilities; congregations and mission plants were started; and a deaconess-training program was launched. The LCMS seminary in Santiago, Dominican Republic, trains students from around the Latin America region.

Remember God's work in the Dominican Republic as you pray:

- **1.** for the seminary students who will enter the seminary this fall, that they would be able to acquire their student visas and other documentation needed to study in the Dominican Republic.
- 2. for seminary students and their families, that they would have a smooth transition to life in a new place away from family and friends. Praise God for these dedicated students who are willing to leave home to obtain a solid theological education.
- **3.** that God would grant the seminary students determination and endurance, so that they might be diligent in their studies

and make the most of their education.

- **4.** for the women studying to be deaconesses, that the theological coursework and intensive practical experience would form them into capable and effective deaconesses.
- **5.** that God would grant strength to our deaconesses as they support the work of pastors by caring for the poor, the marginalized and the sick.
- **6.** with thanksgiving for all the faithful and generous people who have prayed or given of their time or treasures to make the seminary and mercy center a reality.

- **7.** for the seminary professors, that they would be well-prepared to impart wisdom and knowledge to their students.
- **8.** that the Spanish-language theological library at the seminary would be well used and a blessing to the students and faculty.
- **9.** for the families of the professors, that they would adapt easily and find joy in a new country and culture.
- **10.** for Lutheran congregations in Latin America, that they would be prepared to care for and support their pastors physically, mentally and spiritually.
- **11.** for seminary students who are serving vicarages, that they would learn much from their experience and be better prepared for their future ministry.
- **12.** for all the missionaries and leaders of the Dominican church, that they would discern God's

will so that they can build a firm foundation for the church for generations to come.

- **13.** that God would raise up individuals and congregations to support our LCMS missionaries in the Dominican Republic.

- **23.** that the Lutheran mission churches in the Dominican


- Republic would continue to grow and mature through regular worship and Bible study.
