PRAYER OF THE DAY

L: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

L: Let us pray.

C: Lord Jesus, we gather this holy night. We see you wash feet and serve and we know we are called to serve you by serving others. We see you bring forgiveness through your broken body and your shed blood and we know we are righteous. Let us spread your grace and your love through our lives. Amen.

CONFESSION OF OUR SINS

L: We are gathered on this most holy night when God the Son humbly served His friends by washing their dirty feet. This night our Lord Jesus sealed His oneness with His followers through a simple meal of bread and wine. On this night we receive the most precious gift of the forgiveness of sins. God our Father desires a relationship with all His children. For this purpose, He has established the New Testament through His Son, Christ Jesus, who gave His body and shed His blood for our life and salvation.

The Father declares, "I will be their God, and they shall be My people." Thus gathered in the name and presence of the Blessed Trinity, we the people of God make our confession before God and before one another.

- C: We are each born in sin and are by nature unclean.
- L: We name before You our faults and our sins.
- C: We have not been persuaded by Your love for us; selfishness and unkindness have pervaded our words, thoughts, and deeds. We have not loved and served our neighbors, but instead have served ourselves and sought to protect our own interests.
- L: We openly acknowledge our sins and desire to turn away from them.
- C: Standing guilty before God the Holy Trinity, we admit we deserve condemnation and death.
- L: We flee to Christ Jesus, who alone washes away our sins and restores our relationship with the Father.
- C: Having been called, gathered, and enlightened by the Holy Spirit, we cry out to Jesus for mercy and grace, holding on to nothing but His cross.

"Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it." They said to him, "Where will you have us prepare it?" He said to them, "Behold, when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him into the house that he enters and tell the master of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' And he will show you a large upper room furnished; prepare it there." And they went and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet

Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him, Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going back to God, rose from supper. He laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, do you wash my feet?" Jesus answered him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but afterward you will understand." Peter said to him, "You shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no share with me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, "The one who has bathed does not need to wash, except for his feet, but is completely clean. And you are clean, but not every one of you." For he knew who was to betray him; that was why he said, "Not all of you are clean." When he had washed their feet and put on his outer garments and resumed his place, he said to them, "Do you understand what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you. Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them. I am not speaking of all of you; I know whom I have chosen. But the Scripture will be fulfilled,'He who ate my bread has lifted his heel against me.' I am telling you this now, before it takes place, that when it does take place you may believe that I am he. Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever receives the one I send receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me."

STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

- L: After the Last Supper, less than twenty-four hours remained before our Lord was crucified. Events moved rapidly: prayer in Gethsemane, betrayal by Judas, arrest, mock trial, painful beating, the trudge to Golgotha and execution.
- L: Christ's offered body and His shed blood have been given to us in, with, and under the bread and wine in this Holy Mystery.
- C: As He was removed from us in the grave, so we remove the elements and vessels of this Holy Sacrament.
- L: The cross is where Jesus took on our punishment to be able to give us the gift of heaven.
- C: When John the Baptist saw Jesus, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!"
- L: The missal stand holds our worship books that guide our worship life together as we sing praises to God.
- C: As Jesus suffers, joyous songs are not heard.
- L: Our offerings represent one way of serving God and others. They reflect God's greatest offering to the world and to us in sending His Son, Jesus, in human form.
- C: As the offered body of Jesus was removed from sight in burial, so we remove our offerings.
- L: The altar is the place where our Lord Jesus serves us as both host and meal at His banquet feast. The coverings and paraments are made of fine linen and brocade; materials appropriate for feasting with our King.
- C: As our King's body was stripped in crucifixion, so our altar is stripped of its coverings.

- L: Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world. Whoever follows Me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."
- C: The events of Golgotha snuffed out the human life of Jesus, the Light of the world.
